BACKGROUND

Water and Sewer rates have not been increased for ten years. As a result of increased operating costs combined with recent costly water system repairs, the District has depleted its cash reserves, and revenue from rates is no longer adequate to cover operating costs. As a result, the District contracted with Dan Bergmann of IGService to conduct water and sewer financial and rate analysis, working closely with staff, to determine rates for the next five years.

Water and sewer rates must be increased substantially in order for the District to cover increasing operating costs, deferred repairs, and to rebuild District cash reserves. District cash reserves are almost completely depleted. Overall revenue is recommended to be increased approximately 50 percent for both the water and sewer enterprises.

Mr. Bergmann will present study results. The presentation will cover the following for each water and sewer

- Explanation about cost-of-service rate setting and compliance legal requirements
- Historical and projected operating costs, including fund balances
- Review of existing rates
- Methodology for setting rates to different customer groups
- Impact of proposed rates on different customer groups
- Potential timing and steps to proceed with rate increases
